School-Cell Analogy

- In order for a school to run smoothly, there are many different parts that work together to carry out different tasks & functions.
- The same thing happens with all of the organelles in the cell; they work together to carry out the task of the cell.
- Your job is to make a comparison of the parts of the cell to parts of some structure or place in order to help you remember the roles of various cell organelles.

Think of all the parts that make up the structure or place and what they are for

Cell Organelle Word Bank:

- -Vacuole

- -Ribosomes

- -Endoplasmic Reticulum

- Solar Panels in the parking lot— Use the sun's energy to produce power for the school
- School Walls Controls who comes in and goes out of the school.
- Brick Outside Wall- Rigid outer structure that helps the school keep its shape.
- Paper Shredder Breaks down larger paper into small strips of paper
- Lockers Stores needed materials
- Main Office— Controls the daily functions of the school
- **Generator** Supplies energy for the school
- Hallways Allow for students to move between classrooms
- Filing Cabinets in Main Office— Contain student information
- Cafeteria Ribs are for lunch today, and ribs contain a lot of protein.

Examples:

- Chloroplasts are like the Solar Panels in the parking lot— Because they use the sun's energy to produce energy for the cell like the solar panels produce energy for the school
- Cell Membrane is like the School Walls
 - Because it controls who comes in and goes out of the school.
